

 **FQ** Tussie Mussie Bouquet, Natural (106364) Fabric 1  
**A** One 6-1/2" square

 **FQ** Pressed Flower Tonal, Pink (106368) Fabric 2  
**B** Three 3-1/4" squares cut twice diagonally  
**J** Two 5-1/2" x 11-1/2" (trim to 4-1/2" x 10-1/2" once quilted)

 **FQ** Little Leaves, Green (106370) Fabric 3  
**B** Two 3-1/4" squares cut twice diagonally  
**C** Two 2-7/8" squares cut once diagonally  
**K** Two 3/4" X 14-1/2" (sew together for one 28-1/2" piece)

Binding At least 34" of 2" wide continuous bias binding

 **FQ** Pressed Flower Tonal, Yellow (106367) Fabric 4  
**D** Two 3/4" x 8-1/2"  
**E** Two 3/4" x 9"  
**H** Two 4-1/2" x 10-1/2"  
 Binding 90" length of 2" wide bias binding strip

 **FQ** Pressed Flower Tonal, Purple (106366) Fabric 5  
**F** Two 1-1/4" x 9"  
**G** Two 1-1/4" x 10-1/2"  
**M** Two 1-1/2" x 20"

 **FQ** Pressed Flower Paper, Natural (106369) Fabric 6  
**I** One 10-1/2" square  
**L** Two 2-1/4" x 14-1/2" (joining seams need to be placed in the center of the side panels H)

 **FQ** Tussie Mussie Tonal, Pink (106365) Fabric 7  
**M** Two 1-1/2" x 20" (handle lining)

**BUTTONS** Four 5/8" buttons (tote) One 3/8"


**TOTE LINING:** Piece leftover fabric for a scrappy lining or purchase an additional 1/2 yard of your favorite print. NOTE: The lining is made slightly larger than pieced tote, quilted and trimmed.

**BATTING**


One craft size, thick loft batt  
 One 18" x 34" for pieced body  
 Two 2" x 20" (M)

**TOTE PIECING INSTRUCTIONS**

1- Sew the B triangles together as shown below. Press seam allowances in the direction indicated by the arrows.



2- Sew the triangle un Press toward A.




3- Sew C triangles to the corners of the block. Press toward center block A. Trim to an 8-1/2" s




**SCENTIMENTAL FLORALS TOTE**

Approx. body finished size 10" wide x 12" tall x 4" deep

4- Sew a D to the top and bottom of the block. Press toward D. Sew an E to the sides of the block. Press toward E.



5- Sew an F to the top and bottom of the block. Press toward F. Sew a G to the sides of the block. Press toward G.




6- Sew an H to the sides of the block. Press away from H.

7- Sew I to H (see diagram). Press toward I.

8- Sew K and L together. Press toward L. Sew K/L to the top of the bag. Press toward K.




- 9- Layer the lining (wrong side up WSU), batting and pieced bag top (right side up RSU) together. Baste with needle and thread using very long stitches or use a basting spray to hold the layers together.
- 10- Quilt the layers. Suggestions include: Stipple around the bouquet, stitch in the ditch where indicated below, stipple as indicated. Trim the lining and batting flush with the outer edges of the top. The heavier the bag is quilted, the stronger it will be for toting items around. It will also hold its shape nicer. Crosshatch quilting (spaced 1" apart) over the sides (H), top band (L) and back (I) will give add support and give the bag an extra "quilty" look.




- 11- Layer one J (wrong side up) + batting + remaining J (right side up) together. Quilt using a stipple or crosshatching approach. Trim to 4-1/2" x 10-1/2".


- 12- Sew J to the bottom of the block (right sides together). Start and stop the seam 1/4" in from the outer edges. Press toward J.




- 13- Sew the side seam, start and stop 1/4" away the corners. Zig Zag the edges to finish off.



- 14- Sew the long side of J to the bottom edge of the bags back.




- 15- Sew the two short edges of J to the bag. Zigzag to finish off all four sides of J.



- 16- Press the side seams from top to bottom corners to define the bags shape.


- 17- Bind the top edge of the tote using bias binding.

- 18- Layer the M handle lining (wrong side up) + batting + M handle together. Bind the edges using bias binding. Clip the binding around the curved ends before final sewing. Repeat for second handle.




- 19- Attach the handles to the bag 1" away from binding along top of bag and 1-1/2" in from the side seam. Machine stitch in the ditch of the biasbinding at the end of each handle. Sew buttons to the ends of the handles if desired.


