
Pattern Basics

We encourage breaking the rules, but here are a few things you might want to keep in mind:


- Please read through **all** the instructions carefully **before** beginning a project. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern.
- All instructions use a 1/2" seam allowance unless otherwise stated.
- Back stitch at the start and end of each line of stitching.

Common Quilting Acronyms:

FQ = fat quarter (18" x 22")	RS = right side of fabric
WOFQ = width of fat quarter	RST = right sides together
WOF = width of fabric	WST = wrong sides together
LOF = length of fabric	HST = half square triangle
WS = wrong side of fabric	QST = quarter square triangle







Cutting Suggestions


Yardage below is diagrammed on 40" width selvage to selvage. FQs are diagrammed on 20" width.




Directions

Body Assembly:


1. Sew the three **A**s to **B** RST, stopping at the marked points.





2. Stitch the **A**s RST to make the body of the snowman, leaving the neck open.



3. Turn RS out and fill the bottom with walnut shells to help your snowman stand up. Fill the remainder of the body with stuffing. Fold 1/4" to the WS at opening. Set aside.




4. Using a strong thread, sew a gathering stitch around **C**, 1/2" from the edge.
5. Pull the gathering thread and stuff the circle to make the head. Tie off the gathering thread and stitch to the body, gathering in the neck a little as you go, and tilting the head forward so that the face is smooth.




Hat Assembly:

6. Iron the two **D**s WST and the two **E**s WST.
7. Fold **F** in half lengthwise WST and iron making a 1-3/4" x 9" strip.
8. Hand stitch **F** to the edge of **E** to make the top of the hat. Stitch down the edge of **F**.



9. Hand stitch **E/F** to **D**, to complete the hat.



10. Stitch the hat to the snowman's head.
11. Embroider mouth and sew buttons on for eyes, and down the snowman's front.


Scarf:

12. Fold **G** in half along the length RST. Stitch leaving an opening to turn the scarf RS out. Turn RS out, slip stitch opening closed, and dress your snowman.
