Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions

For ease of figuring and construction, all three shapes will use a 2-1/2" square of fabric. You can color the diagram if you are making a planned table runner or just go scrappy.

Paper Pieces A, B, & C: 3/4 yard total or 36 5" Charm Squares cut into four 2-1/2" squares for a total of 140 2-1/2" squares

Background: 3/8 yard

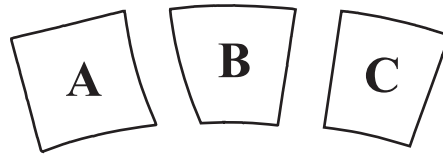
Backing: 25" x 44"

Batting: 25" x 44"

Binding: 3/8 yard

Double Wedding Ring Piecing Instructions

After literally hundreds of requests we finally figured out how to Paper Piece this beautiful pattern! You will only be piecing the arcs, then appliqueing them to the background. There are three shapes in each arc:



Step 1

Center and pin paper to fabric squares, remembering half of B pieces point left, half point right. Fold fabric over and baste using large stitches, taking care on the corners to get crisp points. See basic paper piecing instructions for tips.



Step 2

Lay out basted pieces in order B-C-C-C-C-B-A to create an arc. You will need to Make 20 total arcs.

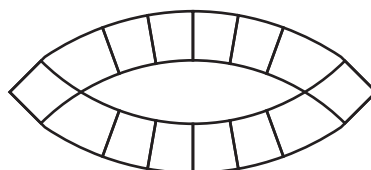


Step 3

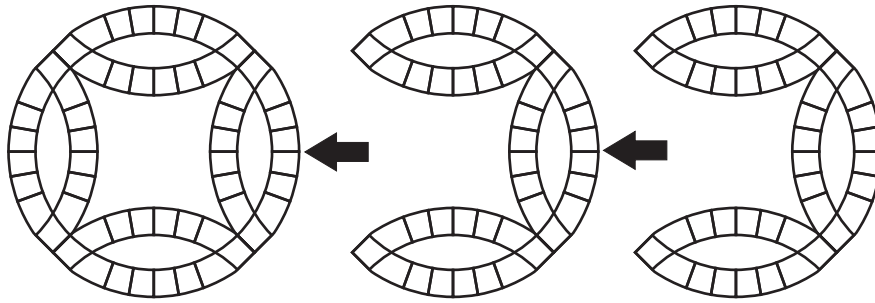
Whip stitch together along edges.

Step 4

Assemble arcs into units. Make 10 total units.



Step 5
Assemble units as shown.



Step 6
Pin ring unit to background. This step is a little tricky, use a flat surface and take care that the background is smooth.

Step 7
Applique rings to background. Start with the center ring and applique the outside edges first. This will stabilize your rings and prevent shifting. Then applique the rest of the edges.

Step 8
On the backside of the quilt, cut a slit through the background fabric between the stitching lines of the arcs. Remove the basting stitches from the front. Carefully pull out the papers from the back. These papers can be used again.

Step 9
Your quilt is now ready to finish. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired and bind.
